Q&A with Directors

- Why am I observing an increasing trend where CPS is seeking parental permission to interview children at school instead of obtaining a court order and meeting with the children at school without parental consent? This approach often poses challenges for mandated reporters when it comes to providing support to students after CPS reports.
 - Since the Greene v. Camreta case in 2009, our county has adopted a practice of seeking parental consent to interview children at school or other locations, whenever it is deemed safe to do so. If seeking parental consent would endanger the child or compromise the investigation, a social worker may seek a court order. The juvenile court is always available to consider urgent requests for interview orders. In the calendar year 2022, our local juvenile dependency court issued 193 orders for DFCS social workers to interview children, and many more children were interviewed at school.
